Overview of Participants



- Around 90 countries participating
- Approximately 460 boxers
- 40 Referee & Judges selected by AIBA
- Approximate number of boxers (24.04.2010)

General Weigh-in



- General Weigh-in will be held at the Sports Palace Gymnasium starting from 07:00 until 09:00
- Each boxer must bring
 - Passport
 - Record Book with annual medical check certificate
 - Accreditation Card
- Boxers must be clean shaved
- No coach will be allowed within the location of the General Weigh-in
- A maximum of 1 registered boxer per weight category per country will be permitted for the General Weigh-in



General Weigh-in



- Registered boxer's weight should not exceed the maximum of the boxer's weight class nor be below the minimum of the boxer's weight class
- The weight registered at the General Weigh-in on the first day decides the boxer's weight class for the entire competition, but this boxer will still be required to weigh-in each day on which this boxer is due to box to ensure that the actual weight on that day does not exceed the maximum of the boxer's registered weight class

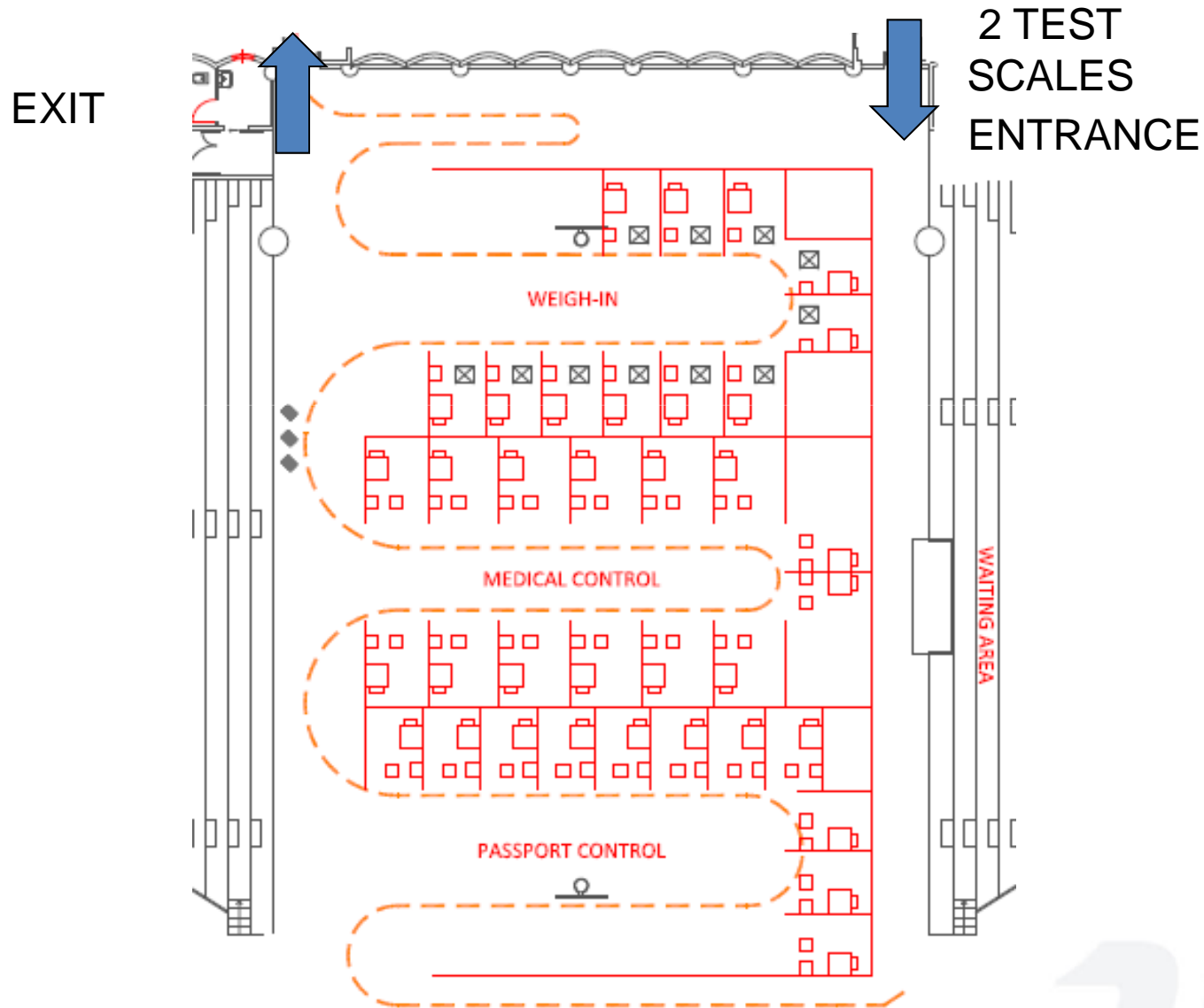


General Weigh-in



- A country may substitute one boxer for another at any time up to the close of the General Weigh-in and the medical examination, provided that the substitute boxer has been entered as reserve for that weight, or any other weight
- Any competitor who has failed to make the weight at the General Weigh-in can enter for the higher or lower weight for which he is qualified if his nation has a free place in that weight

Procedure of the General Weigh-in





The Official Draw



- The Official Draw will take place at the same place as the General Weigh-in from 12:00 – 13:00
- The Official Draw will be conducted by a computerized draw system
- Each Federation can send a maximum of two representatives to attend the Official Draw Ceremony
- After the Official Draw, Swiss Timing and the LOC will distribute the printed draw results to all team representatives onsite



Key Technical & Competition Rules



- The Headguard is now an official equipment which will be provided by AIBA and must be worn in the Ring – personal headguard will not allowed in any circumstance
- Red or partially red colored Gumshield will NOT be allowed to wear
- In the event of a DRAW, the decision will be based on the Judges' "Accepted" scores and in case this is also equal, the Judges will nominate the winner
- No boxer will be saved by the bell
- No boxer declared medically unfit due to injury during the bout can be declared a winner
- Only team coaches acting as seconds will be allowed to enter the Field of Play (FOP) during their boxer's bout





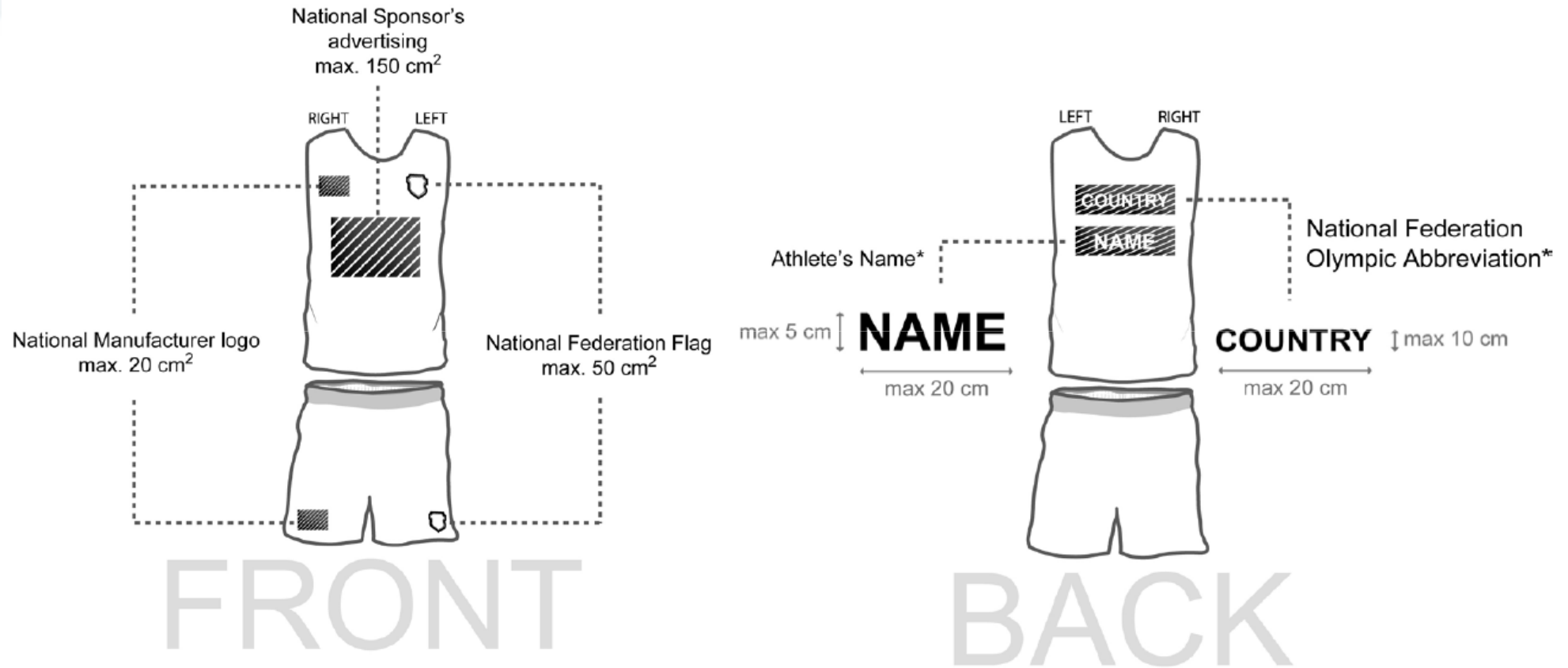
Key Technical & Competition Rules



- Protest Procedure:
 - A protest shall be submitted by the team leader or by the person having the highest position in the team delegation no later than 30 minutes after the completion of the bout; any protest shall be against the decision(s) of the Referee and/or Judges of the bout
 - The protest shall be made in writing and handed to the Chairperson of the Competition Jury with specifying definitive and clear reasons for such protest
 - The protest fee is US\$ 500; an administrative fee of US\$ 100 will be deducted from this amount and the remaining amount will be refunded if the protest is upheld
 - If the protest is rejected, the entire fee will remain with AIBA and not be returned to the protester

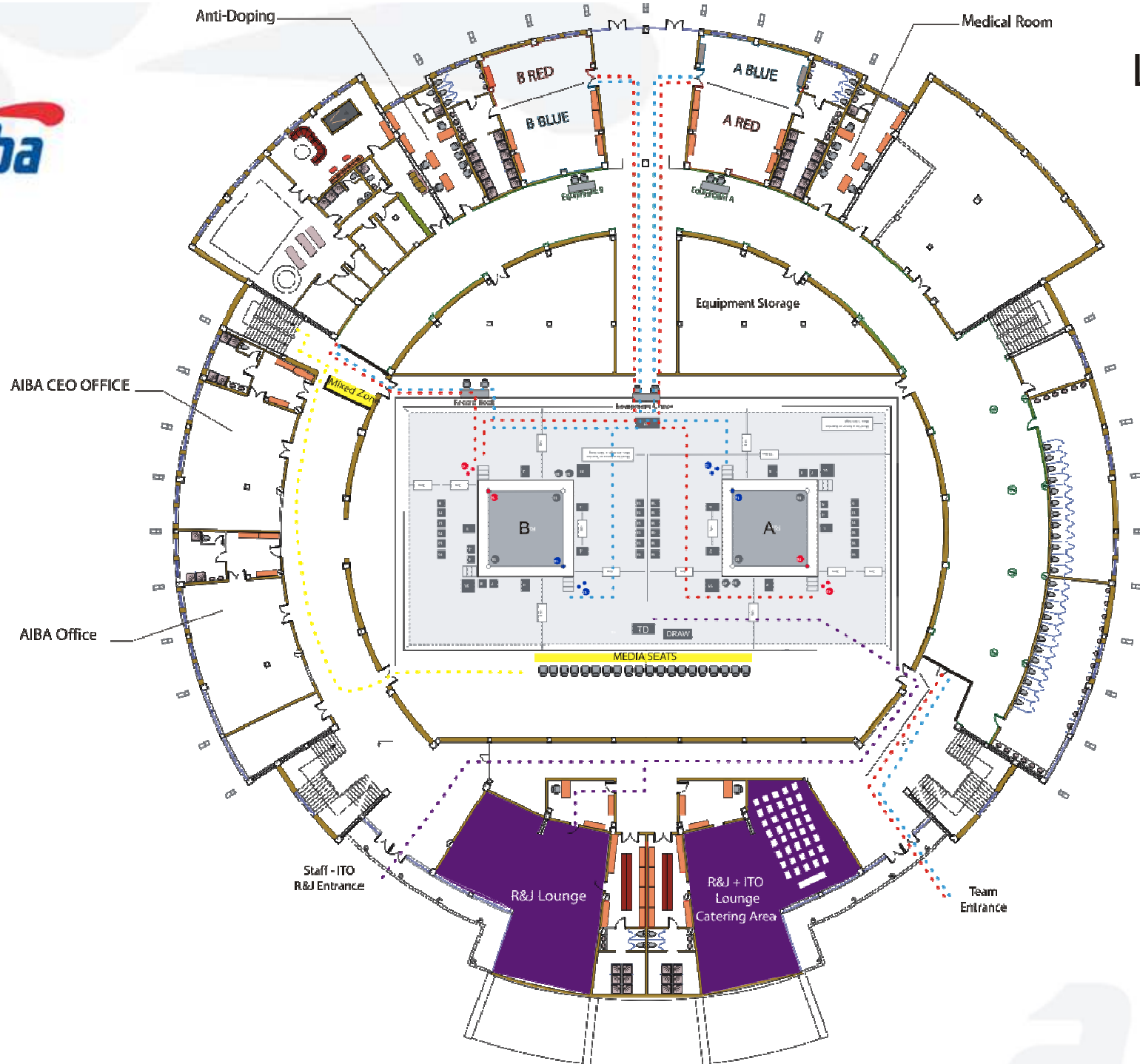


Key Technical & Competition Rules



- Session Passes:
 - Only boxers scheduled to compete on the day will be allowed to access the locker rooms, warm-up area and FOP
 - Each boxer is entitled to receive 3 passes
 - 1 for the boxer
 - 2 for the coaches
 - Passes will be distributed at the Daily Weigh-in and medical check
 - Training schedule and procedure will be available in the Team hotels





LEVEL 1





Medical and Anti-Doping Procedure



- Medical Procedure will be according to the AIBA Rules
- Anti-Doping Procedure will be according to the WADA Code
- After a boxer has been selected for doping control, he will be accompanied by a Chaperone until he arrives at the Doping Control Station
- Non-compliance will lead to Anti-Doping Rule Violation
- Post Bout Medical Checks will take place outside the FOP



Media / Press Relations



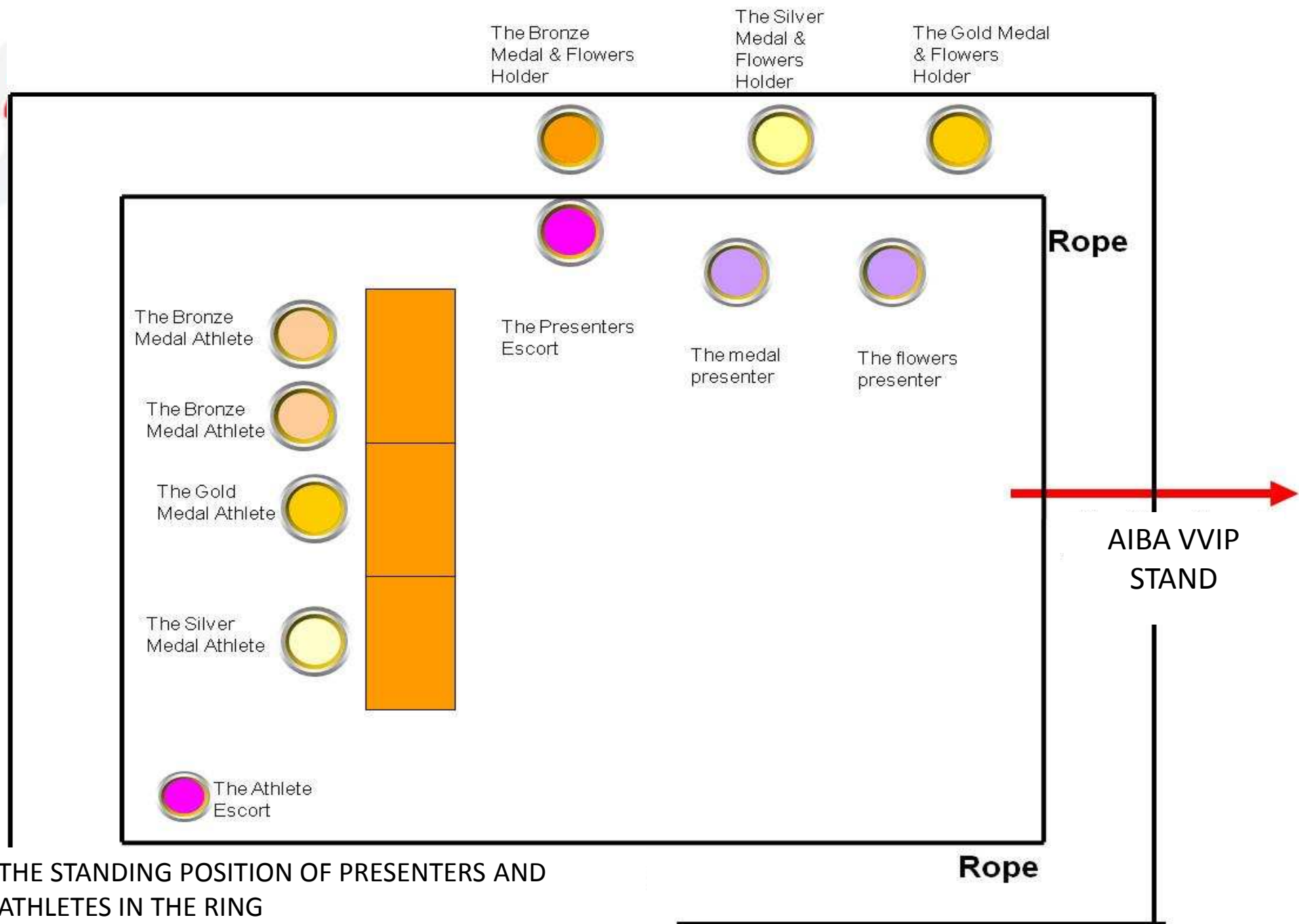
- Athletes & Seconds must pass through the Mixed Zone
- Priority Order for Interview in Mixed Zone
- No Private Media Conference will be permitted



Awards Ceremony



- All medalists in each weight category are required to participate in the Awards Ceremony
- All medalists must wear their own Federation tracksuit
- No boxer is allowed to participate in the Awards Ceremony with any prohibited attire or flag
- The Awards Ceremony will be held in the ring between bouts

Disciplinary Code



- All boxers, team officials (leaders & coaches), Federation representatives and all other member of the AIBA family shall follow and respect the AIBA Disciplinary Code
- All ITOs and R&Js have signed the AIBA “Code of Conduct”
- Proper decorum and respect for property is to be maintained at the Team hotels
